to my classroom five or six times for tutorials to make sure they get it right; it's a complex pattern that takes attention to detail."

Henry Miller and Daniella Nassar were interested in taking the project one step further. They were the first of Salley's students to complete a tetrahybrid, 256 Punnett Square. Even more impressively, Henry and Daniella worked independently, and received no tutorial time with Salley. Daniella shares that she has always wanted to be a scientist, and Salley has helped foster and develop that passion. Henry has been interested in microbiology and hopes to study cancer cells.

Salley explains the significance of their work, "This is the best Christmas present two students could give me. The fact that they got excited about learning and took initiative for their own work gave me the biggest smile. Not only did they go beyond what I had challenged them to investigate; they actually went further with Punnett squares than I had ever gone before. These two have reignited a passion for genetics in me, a veteran teacher of 43 years."
